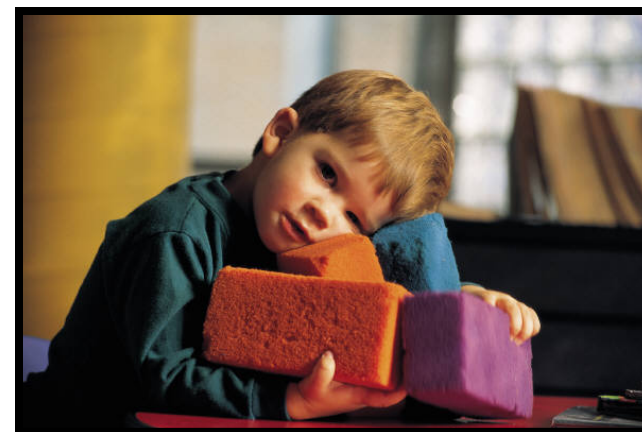

## Early Intervention and Early Childhood Special Education

**Early Intervention Services** are provided on a year-round basis for children with developmental disabilities age birth to three years.



*Referrals may come from:*

- ◆ Parents
- ◆ Physicians
- ◆ Community Preschools
- ◆ Local School District
- ◆ Community Service Providers
- ◆ Regional Evaluation Sources

### **Early Childhood Special Education**

is provided for eligible children with special needs age three until kindergarten (at five). Services are developed based on the child's needs, family preferences, and the recommendations of professionals.

*Services may include:*

- ◆ Instructional or support services in the child's home
- ◆ Individual instruction
- ◆ Small group instruction
- ◆ Specialized classes or support
- ◆ Parent education activities

## Oregon Head Start Prekindergarten Program (OHSPP)

**OHSPP** provides assistance to families with children at risk for school failure.



Program specialists develop individualized plans for services which include:

- ◆ Placement in a community preschool
- ◆ Medical and Nutritional Services
- ◆ Dental Services
- ◆ Mental Health and Social Services
- ◆ Parent Education

Families participate in the program and learn to support their child's development through activities such as:

- ◆ Reading
- ◆ Proper Health Care
- ◆ Regular Program Participation
- ◆ Adult Learning Opportunities



## Migrant Preschool Program

**The Migrant Preschool Program** provides:

- ◆ A Classroom three days per week in Canby
- ◆ Home visits to assist parenting concerns and how to access community services
- ◆ Parent education on a monthly basis
- ◆ Assistance with medical and dental needs

Parents volunteer in the classroom and attend meetings to help resolve community issues. Books are provided to families.



## Child Care Resource and Referral Services

**Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R)** helps to improve the quality, accessibility, and affordability of child care.

CCR&R provides:

- ◆ Training to Child Care Providers
- ◆ A Quarterly Newsletter
- ◆ Information on Current Regulations

Stable child care benefits the local workforce and business community.
